Children's Choir is made up of students in grades 4 – 8 who love to sing! The Children's Choir will sing on the third Sunday of each month, Christmas, Palm Sunday, and First Communion. We will end the year with a special treat. Come and join us and find out what it is all about! **Startup date will be September 30th.**

Youth Choir is made up of students in grades 9-12. They sing on the 4th Sunday of the month at the 10:30 AM Mass. They rehearse on Sunday evenings at 5:30 PM – 6:30 PM. Most of the members then head directly to Youth Group and HS Religious Education. In addition to Mass, the Youth Choir is also our Living Stations Choir and will perform for Good Friday. The Youth Choir sings all types and styles of music. **Startup date will be September 26th.**

Spanish Choir sings to the Lord in Spanish. *¡Cantemos al Señor en español!* They sing all types of liturgical music, including Latin. They also sing for combined choir events such as Corpus Christi and Festival.

Nuestra fe, esperanza y amor están expresados concretamente en la manera en que vivimos. La celebración de los Sacramentos, especialmente la Misa, es el centro de nuestras vidas como Católicos Cristianos, ya que es en la Misa donde celebramos nuestra salvación en Jesús y que El nos nutre con Su Palabra y nos alimenta con Su Cuerpo y Sangre. Si, **los creyentes verdaderos viven su fe asistiendo a Misa cada domingo.** Un Católico que falla en hacer esto no está siendo fiel al Señor, no viviendo—no practicando— lo que Jesús nos enseñó, lo que creemos

Para demostrar que son fieles, Católicos practicantes, se les urge a los feligreses que se registren en la parroquia, que asistan a la Misa semanalmente, y que contribuyan al apoyo económico de la parroquia

Personas con el deseo de recibir el Sacramento de Matrimonio, el bautismo para sus hijos, o servir como padrinos de Bautismo o de Confirmación tienen que ser fieles Católicos practicantes.
