Altar Servers - Just a reminder, check your email regarding changes to the altar server teams and the procedures concerning location during the Eucharistic prayer, and the use of bells and incense. Remember that the bells and incense will only be used at the 9 AM Mass on Sunday. Schedules are posted in the sacristy.

To become an altar server, you must be 10 years old or in 4th grade and you must have received the Sacrament of Communion.

We Remember... During the month of November, we will be honoring those who have gone before us. If you have a picture of a loved one who has died and would like them displayed, please send it to Kelly Kingett with your name, phone number and address on the back. It will be displayed during the month of November on the bulletin board outside the Liturgy office.

Reserved Signs-Please do not sit in the pews marked with the reserved signs. They are there for our lectors and their families. The seats on the opposite side are reserved for handicapped parishioners and their families.

Book of the Gospels - We are looking to purchase a Book of the Gospels in Spanish. We have one in English, but we have nothing for our Spanish Masses. Unfortunately, it is very costly. It will cost almost \$500.00 with the added shipping and handling costs. If anyone would like to make a donation toward the purchase of this book, please call the main office or contact Kelly in the office of Liturgy and Music. As always, thank you for your generosity!

Father Creedon has asked me to report on the status of the changes that have been made recently, and to perhaps answer some concerns that have arisen in regard to these changes. These are the additional changes as mentioned in last weekend's bulletin:

Communion. There are several changes here. First of all, we have reinstated Communion under both species. You do not have to receive both, but Father is now offering it as a visual sign of the Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Second, Father has asked the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to step up on the altar to facilitate the distribution of Holy Communion.

Book of the Gospels. The deacon, acolyte or lector will process with the book of the Gospels during the entrance procession and then they will place the book on the pillow that is provided. At the Gospel Acclamation, the priest or deacon will take the book of the Gospels from the altar and "process" to the ambo where it will be proclaimed.

Altar Cross. The use of a cross on the altar was established when the orientation of the priest changed from facing *away* from the people to the priest facing *toward* the people. Now, when Mass is celebrated, the priest has his back to the cross. That is why the cross was put on the altar – namely to remind and inspire the priest as he prepares and offers the sacrifice. Fr. Creedon removed the gold cross and replaced it with a smaller cross because he didn't want anything to hinder your view of the altar. Please keep in mind that this is a perfectly acceptable alternative. The cross is there for the priests only – not for the people. We have the large cross to reflect on during the entire Mass.

¿Que significa ser un Católico practicante?

Nuestra fe, esperanza y amor están expresados concretamente en la manera en que vivimos. La celebración de los Sacramentos, especialmente la Misa, es el centro de nuestras vidas como Católicos Cristianos, ya que es en la Misa donde celebramos nuestra salvación en Jesús y que El nos nutre con Su Palabra y nos alimenta con Su Cuerpo y Sangre. Si, **los creyentes verdaderos viven su fe asistiendo a Misa cada domingo.** Un Católico que falla en hacer esto no está siendo fiel al Señor, no viviendo—no practicando— lo que Jesús nos enseñó, lo que creemos.

Para demostrar que son fieles, Católicos practicantes, se les urge a los feligreses que se registren en la parroquia, que asistan a la Misa semanalmente, y que contribuyan al apoyo económico de la parroquia

Personas con el deseo de recibir el Sacramento de Matrimonio, el bautismo para sus hijos, o servir como padrinos de Bautismo o de Confirmación tienen que ser fieles Católicos practicantes. La celebración de estos Sacramentos no son meros eventos familiares o sociales, sino celebraciones de fe para los verdaderos creyentes. **Así pues, la póliza de la Parroquia de la Sagrada Familia es que, para comenzar la preparación para Matrimonio, para tener un niño (a) bautizado, o para servir como padrino o madrina para Bautismo o Confirmación, una persona tiene que estar registrado y asistir a la Misa semanal en la parroquia por lo menos tres (3) meses, antes de presentar su petición.**

BAUTIZOS Se celebran cada primer y tercer domingo del mes

- La Iglesia recomienda bautizar a los niños en las primeras semanas después de haber nacido.
- Los padres tienen que ser miembros registrados y practicantes de esta parroquia.
- Los padrinos tienen que ser Católicos practicantes que han recibido los Sacramentos del Bautismo, de la Confirmación y de la Comunión; si son pareja casada, tienen que ser casados por la Iglesia.
- Los padres y padrinos tienen que asistir a una charla preparatoria.

PRIMERAS COMUNIONES Y CONFIRMACIONES

- La Primera Comunión se recibe a la edad de siete años (2º Grado), y la Confirmación en el 8º Grado.
- Se celebran después de por lo menos un año de educación religiosa.
- Los candidatos y sus padres tienen que ser miembros registrados y practicantes de esta parroquia.

MATRIMONIOS

- Las parejas Católicas están moralmente obligadas a casarse por la Iglesia. Casarse únicamente por lo civil o convivir sin casarse son pecados graves.
